Covid-19 Route Map: Step 4 Guidance

In line with the document the Parish received from the Bishops of England and Wales we have decided to retain social distancing for the purposes of seating on the side aisles of All Saints Church and on the right-hand side of St Thomas Aquinas Church. All other seating will have no social distancing limits. This therefore provides an option for those who feel vulnerable and would welcome some extra space while increasing capacity so that we don't have to turn anyone away from Mass. We strongly encourage the wearing of face masks in the church and ask people to continue to be mindful of the personal space of others. Holy Communion will continue to be distributed in one kind (The Sacred Host) but can now be received either in the hand or on the tongue. If you wish to receive Holy communion on the tongue please wait to be called forward after everyone else has received Holy Communion in the hand. The physical sign of peace remains suspended and the Holy water stoups at the back of the church will remain empty. Baskets will be available at the end of the Mass at the back of church for the offertory collection; we are very grateful however to those who have set up standing orders and this now remains the preferred option for regular parish giving. The congregation is permitted to join in with the singing, but we will not be using hymn books for the time being. The one-way system for exiting our churches has been removed so please use the main doors for both entering and exiting the building. Please continue to use the hand sanitiser provided. We will keep these procedures under constant review and make changes if our local situation requires it. *Thank you all for your cooperation and understanding.*

Parish First Holy Communion Programme 2021-2022

If your child will be in year 3 or above from *September 2021* and you would like to enrol them on the Parish 'First Holy Communion Programme' please e-mail the parish office as soon as possible at: staq@uwclub.net We will send you an application form which will need to be completed and returned to the parish office with a copy of your child's Catholic Baptism Certificate. If your child was baptised in the parish at either St Thomas Aquinas or All Saints Church we will already have your child's baptism certificate. If your child will be in year 3 at St Thomas Aquinas School or in year 3 or 4 at Bishop Parker School there is a separate programme and you do not need to enrol of this Parish Course. There is a choice this year of either a Wednesday session 6:00pm – 7:00pm (Group One) Saturday session 3:00pm-4:00pm (Group 2). The course will begin on Saturday 11th September and Wednesday 15th September 2021 respectively and will take place every Saturday / Wednesday thereafter in St Thomas Aquinas Church Meeting Room (MK2 2JE). Weekly Mass and Course attendance is essential to complete the Programme. Further details will be sent with enrolment forms on application to the Parish Office.

News from the Diocese

Bishop David has appointed three new Episcopal Vicars to oversee the ministry of three newly initiated vicariates. The three vicariates will cover the areas of governance ([Servant King](#)), clergy ([Priest](#)) and mission ([Prophet](#)).

Fr Simon Penhalagan (Prophet),
Fr Andy Richardson (Priest) and
Fr Christopher Perry (Servant-King)

will take up their responsibilities from September 2021.

They have been appointed under canon 476
'Whenever the correct governance of a diocese requires it, the diocesan bishop can also appoint one or more episcopal vicars, namely, those who in a specific part of the diocese or in a certain type of affairs or over the faithful of a specific rite or over certain groups of persons possess the same ordinary power which a vicar general has by universal law...'

Announcing the vicariates Bishop David said
"In order to be more effective in our core business of mission, I have divided the diocesan agencies into three groupings. Three priests have a share in my episcopal oversight of the Curia and those agencies which support, promote and develop these groups, named after the three different offices of Christ"

The Episcopal Vicars will meet with **Bishop David** and the new Vicar General, **Canon Michael Harrison** regularly, as this new structure takes effect.
