Synod on Synodality 2021-2023

The Synod of Bishops in AD 2023 is entitled: "For a Synodal Church: Communion, Participation and Mission" and Pope Francis has initiated a three-year synodal journey with three phases: diocesan - continental - universal.

The diocesan phase of the Synod will include consultation with the entire People of God: Clergy, Religious and the Lay Faithful. The key element is the process which includes prayer and conversation with Graceful Listening, Graceful Speaking and Discernment. For this synodal journey to be authentic it must be rooted in Sacred Scripture, Sacred Tradition and the Sacrifice of the Mass for these are the ways the Holy Spirit inspires and influences us.

Such 'holy' conversations might include:

1. How can we be more welcoming as a Christian community?
2. To whom do we listen?
3. How can we be more honest in our dealings with each other?
4. How might we celebrate better the Mass?
5. How well do we work together for the mission of the Church?
6. How can you personally, our parish and our diocese be more outward-facing?
7. In what ways might we improve our dialogue and relationship with other Christians?
8. How can we make the Church more participatory and increase co-responsibility?
9. What new processes of decision-making and decision-taking might be needed?
10. How do we form people to make them more capable of "journeying together"?

Essentially we are being asked:

- What do you think that the Church should keep doing?
- What could the Church stop doing that allows for a focus on what really matters?
- What new things should the Church consider doing?
